**1. PRESENTATIONS**

1. Christopher Garcia, Office of City Clerk, updates on NC elections, CANDIDATE FILING HAS OPENED.
2. Rob Wilcox, Director, Community Engagement and Outreach Office of Los Angeles City Attorney Mike Feuer, to ask the Neighborhood Councils to take action against gun violence in schools. Last year, following the tragedy in Parkland, Florida, City Attorney Mike Feuer convened the Los Angeles Blue Ribbon Panel on School Safety. The panel issued a report with over 30 recommendations.
3. Ashley Stracke, Director, Neighborhood Services, Office of the Mayor, to announce Mayor Eric Garcetti's 2019 Great Streets Challenge, a \$2 million partnership program between Angelenos and the City of Los Angeles to transform streets into community public spaces, as part of the Mayor's Great Streets Initiative. This year, the Great Street team will be awarding ten communities up to \$2.5 million in outreach support and infrastructure investments, to develop creative and impactful ways of transforming our streets into vibrant public spaces. The Great Street team will give an overview of the grant and present on what makes a successful application. Applications are due April 1st.
4. Richard Brady, Matrix Consulting Group, is conducting a study of the Los Angeles Police Department (the "Basic Car Area Study") for the Los Angeles Police Commission and a critical part of this assessment is public input. He will also be conducting a survey of attendees.

**2. LEGISLATIVE**

1. RECONSIDER The Los Angeles Neighborhood Council Coalition (LANCC) (XXXXXX Neighborhood Council) strongly opposes the Board of Neighborhood Commissioners (BONC) to use Ad Hoc committees to discuss the business of Neighborhood Councils. The Neighborhood Council system is built on transparency and communication and BONC Ad Hoc committees do not have to comply with the Ralph M. Brown Act and does not allow for the public or Neighborhood Councils to weigh in on the subject.
