The Mayor's Executive Directive #1 has too many "loopholes" Amendments are needed

The _____Neighborhood Council supports the ED1 Ordinance (**CF23-0623**) **IF AMENDED** to include the guidelines sent by United Neighbors of the PLUM committee, with a particular focus on the importance of the following amendments:

- 1. Limit the number of waivers and off menu incentives to a total of 6
- 2. Require rear 15' setback to allow for trees to grown and storm water to be captured
- 3. Prevent post-development conversion of nonresidential spaces to market rate units
- 4. Protect R1, HPOZs and Historic Districts in their entirety
- 5. Ensure that substandard streets/high-fire zones do not qualify for ED1 fast track approval
- 6. Require ED1 projects meet minimum Tier 2 TOC qualifications

Projects that don't meet these requirements under ED1 would need to go through discretionary approval

2. **CF 15-0389-S2 Community Councils** (Brentwood Community Council & Pacific Palisades Community Council) granting community councils the same privileges as those afforded to neighborhood councils under Los Angeles Administrative Code Section 22.819.

The VANC Executive team is opposed to this council file:

- They resemble lobbying groups vs Neighborhood Councils
- Pacific Palisades includes ONLY residents

- Brentwood charges yearly dues and are removed if delinquent
- Opens the door for HOAs to be included
- If they want the same privileges as NCs become an NC
 - ✓ Be required to take NC required training such as:
 - Anti-Bias Training
 - Gender Expression and Gender Identity Training
 - Ethics Training
 - Brown Act
 - Code of Conduct
 - If they receive city funds, Funding Training
 - ✓ Have their Bylaws approved by BONC with mandatory inclusions
- Unintended consequence NCs may wish to change status to Community Councils since their rules are less rigid
- 3. **LAPD Air Support CF23-1422** City Controller Kenneth Mejia released an audit of LAPD's Air Support Division "to determine whether the current size of the LAPD's helicopter program and its scope of operations are justified

Police Chief Moore stated "that the Air Support Division's activities play a critical role in our public safety mission here in Los Angeles, and especially now due to a reduced LAPD force, and considering the size of the 260 square mile San Fernando Valley. Their flights frequently result in their arrival at calls for service ahead of our patrols aiding responding officers with critical information and situational awareness. Air support also provides added patrols to detect and prevent crimes including residential burglaries while also responding to officers' assistance calls involving violent and highly dangerous situations."
